Calgary, AB - Following approval from its board of directors today, the Canadian Cattlemen's Association (CCA) will be presenting several recommendations to the federal government on the current suite of business risk management programs that should help ease, for the short-term, financial difficulties currently being faced by producers.

Canadian beef producers have struggled since the drought in Western Canada in 2002, the BSE crisis in 2003, of which the industry has still not recovered and current factors such as high grain prices, a weak U.S. dollar, and increased regulatory, fuel and labour costs. Although the federal government has programs in place to assist producers, they are currently not meeting the needs of the majority of producers.

"There are shortcomings with these programs," says Hugh Lynch-Staunton, CCA president. "Reference margins are declining because of several consecutive years of disasters, natural and due to BSE, and this is leaving the CAIS program largely ineffective. In addition, because these reference margins are linked to the federal Advance Payments Program, producers are finding it difficult to access these funds. We appreciate the funding that the federal and Alberta governments have announced, but this is not meeting the needs of some of the producers who need it most."

The CCA is recommending that the federal Advance Payments Program be decoupled from a producers' reference margin. It also believes that a special advance per head (for feeder cattle, cows, etc.) be offered based on each producers' ending 2006 cattle inventory as listed on their Canadian Agricultural Income Stabilization (CAIS) supplementary form. Although there are other options - such as the interim advance through CAIS or the targeting advance which is available to the hog industry - the CCA is recommending the special advance because it is bankable and likely more timely.

"The special advance is relatively simple and we believe it is a timely solution until a long-term strategy can be implemented. There have been concerns that the 2004 special advance resulted in a number of overpayments but we believe there were additional factors that affected this. These payments were also added as eligible income and therefore reduced the CAIS payments that producers would have otherwise received," says Lynch-Staunton. "However, producers must be aware that this would just be an advance and that there may possibly be overpayments."

To make the programs currently available to industry more accessible and to ensure that all programs are national in scope and in treatment, the CCA is requesting that the government:

- Address the issue of producers' declining reference margins. If this is not addressed, the new AgriStability program will not work for Canadian cattle producers.
- Eliminate the viability test which requires that producers have positive reference margins in two of the three years used to calculate their reference margins. With the economic situation that has affected producers over the past few years, many producers who would be viable operations under normal market circumstances have now been removed from the program.
- Allow producers who might have opted out of CAIS to participate in the program at this time when they need it most, if they pay their fee and a nominal penalty.
- Allow producers across Canada the option of using the better of either the Olympic average or the average of the last three years to calculate their reference margins. Currently, Alberta is offering its producers this option.
- Allow custom feeding to be included as a production indicator on the online structural change calculator used to predict CAIS payments and/or reference margins.
- Change the AgriInvest Allowable Net Sales (ANS) calculation to include 90 per cent of the custom feeding income and custom feeding expense amounts reported on a producer's tax return instead of the 50 per cent currently proposed.
- Allow producers the option of calculating their ANS on an accrual basis or cash basis, regardless of the method used to file their income tax.
- Remove the annual contribution limit of \$22,500 and maximum contribution limit of \$375,000.

The CCA does not agree with having a cap of any kind on a program and does not support safety net programs that provide preferential treatment to certain sized agricultural operations. Differential treatment of larger operations puts them at a distinct competitive disadvantage.

CCA representatives have been working with government over the past several weeks to develop a strategy to improve the long-term competitive position of the beef cattle industry. The CCA will be communicating these important considerations with federal government officials to assist producers in this period of transition.

John M. Beerwort Named 2007 Curtis Clark Award Winner

John M. Beerwort of Beevern Holsteins, Knowlton, Quebec, has won the 2007 Curtis Clark Achievement Award. The announcement of his selection came during the National Holstein Show at the 85th Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto, Ont., on November 9th. Beerwort is the 21st recipient of this award which honours the memory of the late Curtis Clark, a respected Holstein breeder and showman from Acme Holsteins, Carstairs, Alberta.

John Beerwort has been involved with dairy cattle all his life. A 4-H member while growing up, he was a member of the 1949 Quebec 4-H judging team which competed successfully at the Royal Winter Fair. In 1950, following the death of his father, Beerwort took over the family farm in Brome, Que. He went on to breed and develop an outstanding Holstein herd under the Beevern prefix, earning a Master Breeder shield from Holstein Canada in 1976. Passionate about showing and "show cows", Beerwort has been exhibiting cattle at shows for over 60 years. He has bred and developed many show winners and won numerous Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor banners. One of his early show winners was his "Little White Cow", Beevern Fifty-Five Thelma, who was grand champion many times at local fairs in Quebec.

The Beevern herd was dispersed in 1980. The following year, Beerwort became the managing partner in Beerwort ET Farm. This farm garnered numerous All-Canadian and All-Quebec nominations and sold several bulls to A.I. centres. In 1988, Beerwort managed the show herd for Showcase Holsteins of California, which also resulted in several All-American and All-Canadian nominations.

An official dairy cattle judge for many years, Beerwort judged the Royal Winter Fair Holstein Show in 1986. He has judged numerous major shows across Canada, as well as in Australia, Colombia, Brazil, Uruguay and the United States. He has also served on several All-Canadian and All-Quebec nominating and selection committees.

Beerwort is a past member of Holstein Canada's Type Classification Advisory Board and the Quebec Holstein Branch show committee. He is also a past president of the Brome County Holstein Club and Brome Exhibition, and a past director of Eastern Breeders Inc. In 2002, he was presented with the Pierre Leonard Trophy at the Exposition Internationale Holstein Quebec in recognition for his many contributions to the Holstein breed.

Today at 77 years of age, Beerwort remains active in the cattle business by owning, merchandising and exhibiting top quality show animals with members of his family.

While Beerwort's accomplishments are many, perhaps his greatest contribution to the dairy cattle industry has been the large number of young breeders he has helped along the way. His love for the Holstein cow and willingness to share his knowledge and advice has helped scores of young breeders to improve their herds.

A proud family man, John Beerwort and his wife of 54 years, Noella, are the parents of six children, 13 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Five of their six children are still actively involved in the dairy cattle business with their families - Kenneth (Beevern Holsteins), Nancy (Cherry Crest Holsteins), Sheila (Eastwest Holsteins), Kathy (Lookout Holsteins & Jerseys), and John Jr. (Royalty Holsteins) - with another son, Raymond, working in Alberta. A son-in-law, Callum McKinven of Lookout Holsteins & Jerseys, won the Curtis Clark award in 2000.

The Curtis Clark Achievement Award is sponsored by the Alberta Holstein Branch and is awarded annually to the dairy cattle exhibitor who possesses the necessary attributes to be respected by his peers. Selection of the winner is made by former recipients of the award.

SMA CARRIERS IDENTIFIED

It has been determined that Alfa Creek Jolt Heratio ET (M) 1974:18 is a carrier of the recessive gene known as SMA (Spinal Muscle Atrophy).

To be identified as a carrier of the SMA gene, an animal must have at least two offspring that have been determined to be SMA and these offspring must be DNA typed to identify parentage, tested at a 90% confidence level or higher as being a carrier with the DNA marker test, or tested positive with the new SMA gene test.

For the first time in four years and six months, Canadian breeding cattle are on their way to customers in the United States.

On Monday, November 19th the U.S. border opened to all Canadian cattle born on or after March 1, 1999 and beef from cattle of any age. Although everyone anticipated the re-opening, there were definitely concerns. Just three days earlier, on November 16th, R-CALF made a motion for a Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) filed with the U.S. District Court in South Dakota. Had it been accepted, it would have prevented Rule 2 from coming into effect until a hearing on R-CALF's request for a preliminary injunction could be heard.

Anticipation built among cattle breeders who knew that Pierre Trudeau, a CLGA Board Member, would be proceeding to the border on Monday afternoon. His email at 6:45 p.m. said it all, "It's done. The first load crossed the High Gate border one hour ago!" And thus, without fanfare, thirty-nine purebred, registered Holstein heifers were successfully shipped to one purchaser in the United States. Congratulations poured in to Trudeau International Livestock Sales of Ste-Julie, Quebec who confirmed that the crossing had proceeded smoothly and quickly.

The entire Canadian industry has been looking forward to the re-opening of the U.S. border since it was closed following the discovery of BSE in Canada. Rick McDonald, Executive Director of the Canadian Livestock Genetics Association is encouraged and adds, "We believe that resumption in trade between Canada and the USA will provide the confidence needed for us to rebuild the lost industry infrastructure." The Canadian Cattlemen's Association agrees and reports, "The

Canadian industry is committed to meeting the domestic and international animal health and food safety requirements. There are a number of multi-layered safeguards in place to ensure food and animal safety and Canada recently implemented an enhanced feed ban to accelerate the eradication of BSE in the Canadian herd." Canadian stakeholders are confident that resumption in trade between Canada and the USA will help to open other markets. McDonald summarizes, "We are now seen to be "walking the talk" by using the science-based trade rules (based on the OIE code) that we have been asking other countries to apply to us. The first priority will be Mexico."

Even before yesterday's successful crossing, arrangements were underway by various exporters to resume shipping of breeding cattle. CLGA President Shelley Doan says, "We have a load of Jerseys that (Walker Farms International) bought when the border closed. It will be going to Pennsylvania." When asked to foresee the future, Shelley says, "Everyone expected something from R-Calf." At the end of the day, there is no guarantee that the border won't close again but, for now, it is "Business as usual."

The CLGA thanks all our Industry Partners and the Government of Canada for their dedication to achieving this goal. In addition to further expansion of market opportunities for live cattle, we will now be able to turn our attention to the resumption of trade in small ruminants with the USA.
